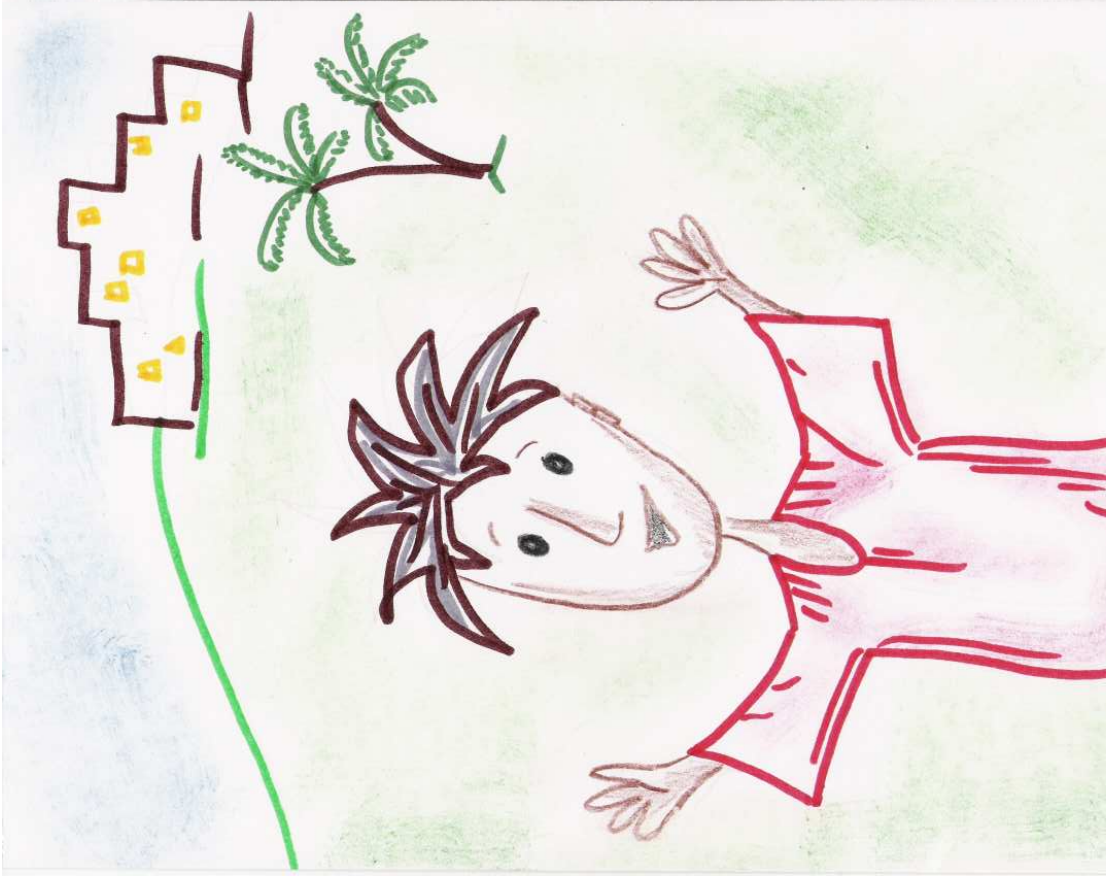

It is also important to remember that everyone sins sometimes, like Jonah did. But Jesus forgives us when we sin, if we ask him.

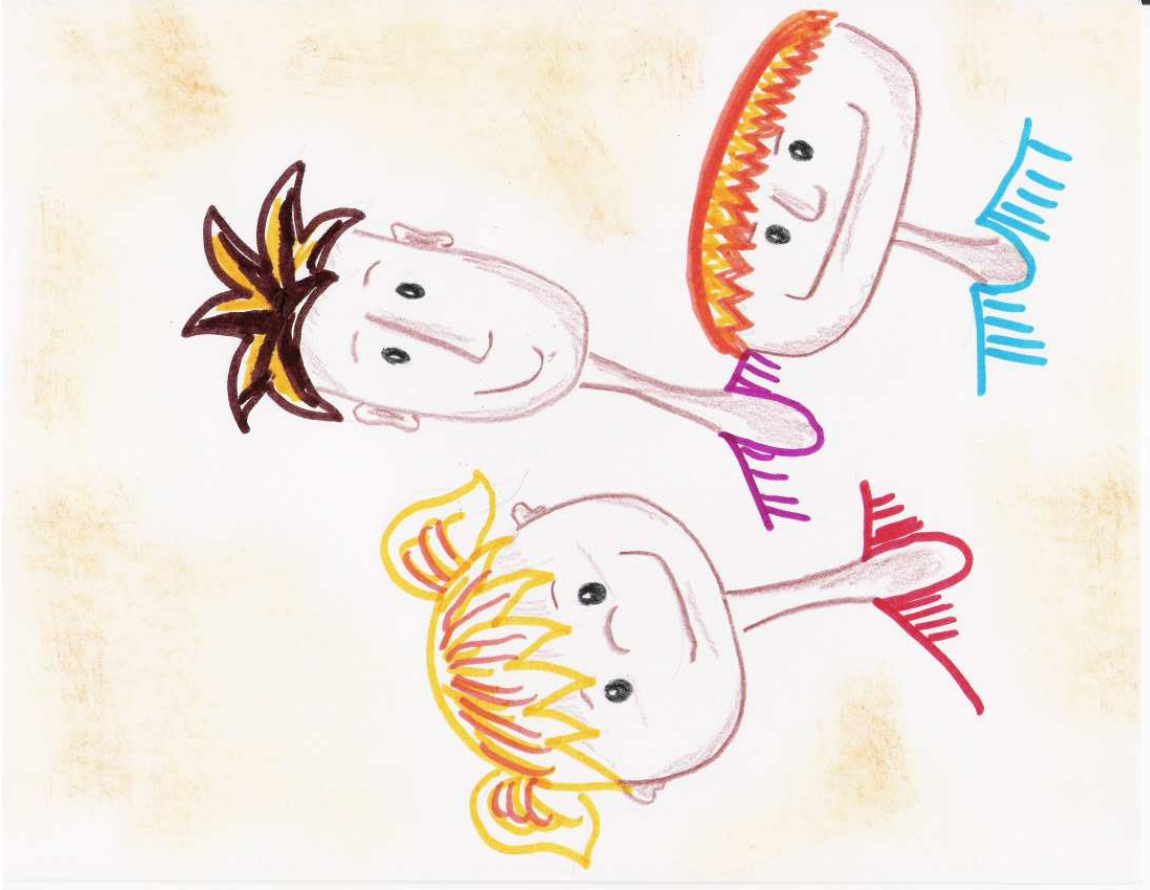
God forgave Jonah, and he forgives us too.

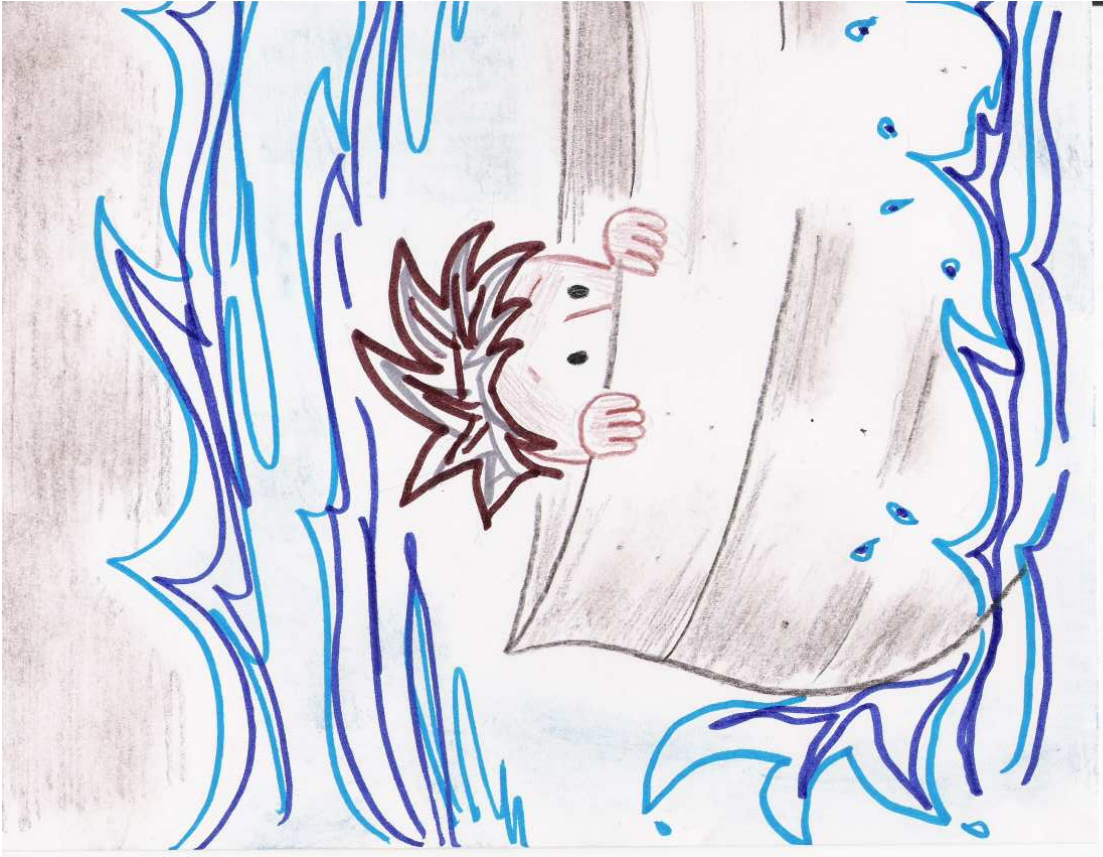


One day God came to Jonah and told him to travel to a city called Nineveh.

He decided to get on a boat and run away instead.





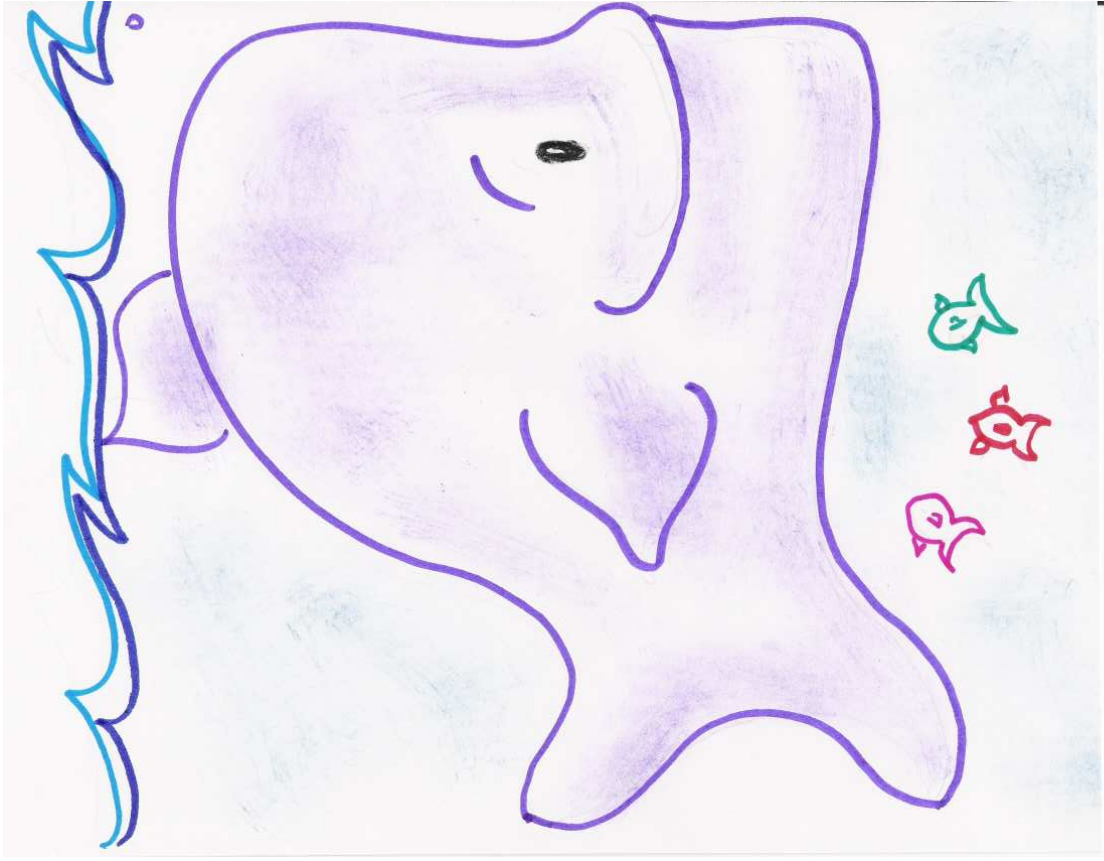
Jonah knew now that he needed to obey.
